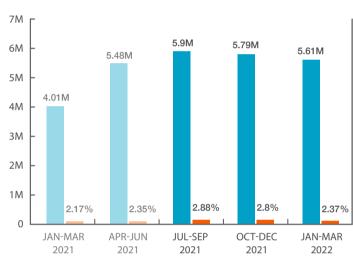
DURING JANUARY TO MARCH 2022:

- MARCH 2022 JOURNEY NUMBERS AT THEIR HIGHEST LEVEL SINCE OCTOBER 2019 over two million journeys were made across the bridges in a single month for the first time since before the pandemic started
- SILVER JUBILEE BRIDGE TRAFFIC INCREASED WHILST MERSEY GATEWAY TRAFFIC DIPPED
 SLIGHTLY Silver Jubilee Bridge traffic grew very slightly as a proportion of the total traffic across the river, but almost 85% of crossings so far in 2022 were made across the new bridge
- OVER 97.5% OF JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME the vast majority of people are paying for their journeys by midnight the day after they cross
- OVER 90% OF PAYMENTS ARE MADE THROUGH DIGITAL OR AUTOMATED CHANNELS the merseyflow website, the merseyflow quick pay app and auto top-up options are widely used by customers

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.

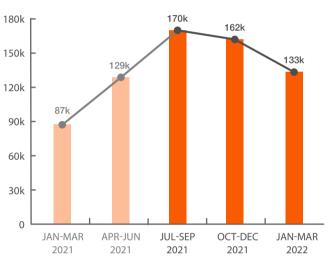
March 2022 journey numbers highest since 2019

Total journeys and number of PCNs issued

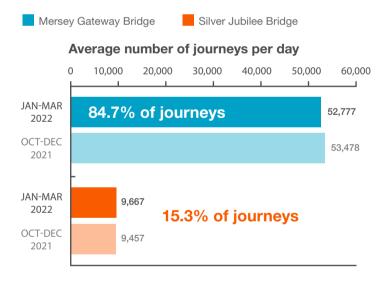


PCNs decrease as a % of journey numbers

PCNs issued

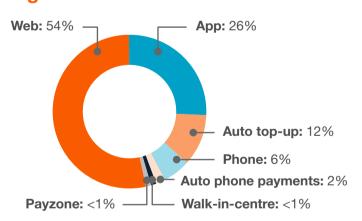


Bridge usage from January – March 2022
